- In view of Company's nature of business, revenue is unevenly spread through out the year hence result for the quarter is not representative for revenue and profit of the entire year.
- 3 Subsequent, to the quarter / year-end, the company has agreed to invest 50% stake in Kraus Casuals Private Limited (Kraus) on a fully diluted basis for a total consideration of ₹16,651 lakhs. Upon completion of the acquisition of shares, Kraus would become a subsidiary of the company.
